On Foot

South Bank is a fantastic place to explore on foot. The river walkway runs from Westminster Bridge to Blackfriars Bridge. It's only a ten minute walk across Waterloo Bridge from Covent Garden and minutes away from The Houses of Parliament by crossing Westminster Bridge.

By Tube

The closest underground station is Waterloo where the following lines can be accessed:

Northern, Bakerloo, Jubilee* or Waterloo & City.

The area is also served by the following:

Southwark: Jubilee* line

Embankment: District & Circle, Bakerloo and Northern lines

Westminster: District & Circle and Jubilee* lines

* Jubilee line stations have disabled access

By Bus

The Riverside (RV1) Bus Service is an easy way of getting around. It links over thirty of London's attractions on its route from South Bank to Bankside, London Bridge, Tower Gateway and Covent Garden.

Buses operate between 0600-midnight every ten minutes. See below for more details.

By Boat

This area is served by the following piers: Westminster, Waterloo Millennium, Embankment, Festival and Bankside.

By Train

Waterloo, Waterloo East and Charing Cross are the closest mainline rail stations.

By Air

Regular bus, tube and rail services link the major airports below with central London.

Situated just 10 miles from South Bank this is the most convenient airport to reach London's city centre. Take the Docklands Light Railway, (DLR) directly to Canning Town and change for the Jubilee line to Waterloo.

Serving London and South England, this international airport has an express rail service direct into Victoria mainline and underground station. Mainline services also arrive at Waterloo via Clapham Junction.

Large international airport close enough to travel into central London by tube. Take the Piccadilly line to Green Park and Jubilee line direct to Waterloo. Alternatively take the Heathrow Express to Paddington.

www.stanstedairport.com

Useful for budget airlines Ryanair and easyJet amongst others. Take the Stansted Express into Liverpool Street mainline and underground station.

Car Parking
